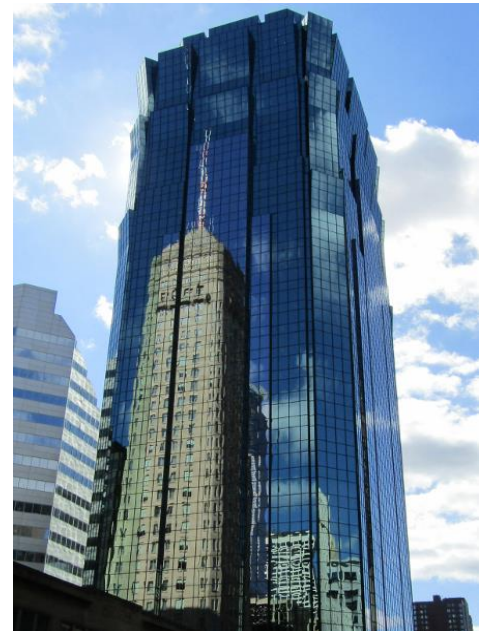


4) What was the profession of the father of the "Captain" depicted in Rembrandt's "The Night Watch"?
